From the desk of Rabbi Leonard Sarko

The end of September thru mid-October marks a time when we are immersed in our High Holy Day season. For the Jewish people it is a time of retrospection, a time of taking a good long look at our acts this past year. This begs the question, what does it mean to be Jewish, to be a religious person within our faith?

Abraham Joshua Heschel said: "A religious man is a person who holds God and man in one thought at one time, at all times, who suffers harm done to others, whose greatest passion is compassion, whose greatest strength is love and defiance of despair."

To hold God and humanity in one thought. To approach life in this way, allows one a sense of wonder, a sense of beauty, a sense of life having significance. It is this sense that is lacking in atheists, in agnostics – people who travel through the world, travel through their life, with a void deep within. They lack nefesh, the essence, that makes life so wonderful to live.

What is it to act as a Jew, better yet, to act as a religious Jew? Our torah defines it through mitzvot, ethical acts described in our canon. 613 precepts that has characterized Jews through the millennia. But it is not just the blind following of the mitzvot that makes a Jew. Judaism expresses itself not only in formal compliance with the law but also in a living experience. There is a flavor, a scent and warmth to mitzvot. The most important thing for a Jew, the most important thing in life—to feel the presence of the Almighty and the gentle pressure of God's hand resting upon our shoulders.

Ultimately a religious Jew feels that something extra that cannot be explained. Much like the unpronounceable name of God, there is a nefesh, an essence in Judaism, which fuses with our soul, that makes us different, that makes us who we are, that is the religious soul of our being.

Our holiday season is a time to reflect on our past. Yet we are to use that reflection to plan for the future. What a wonderful gift this is. We have within our religion a chance for a time-out, a chance to pause, to take a breath. Most of the time we act with great impatience, with a fury of action, careening down the pathway of life. The holidays give us a chance for an intermission. We can take this time to focus on what is important in our lives and what we wish to try to accomplish in the coming year.

My prayer for you is that you take this holiday time, and truly plan for acts you wish to accomplish this coming year. May you fulfill those acts not only as Jews, but as valued human beings. The world can always use more people to act humane.

ALFRED RATNER LIBRARY NEWS

Winner of the National Jewish Book Award for Biography, is the title, *Witness: Lessons from Elie Wiesel's Classroom* by Ariel Burger. Ariel Burger's new memoir is a study of Elie Wiesel's lessons and teachings. Burger first met Wiesel at age fifteen; he then became a student of Wiesel when he was in his twenties, and his teaching assistant when he was in his thirties. *Witness* follows Burger as he grows intellectually, spiritually, emotionally, and watching his relationship with Wiesel evolve from hero worship to mutual respect. Most of the book focuses on Wiesel as a teacher; Wiesel said "I am a Teacher first." Burger shares anecdotes from the classes he attended as a graduate student and while working as Wiesel's teaching assistant. In the classroom, Wiesel always returned to central themes from his life and teaching, including topics of the Holocaust and human rights, memory, faith, doubt, madness and rebellion.

A final highlight of *Witness* is the recommended reading list which includes books that were central to the discussions in specific chapters as well as those books that were a consistent part of Wiesel's teachings. This list gives readers the opportunity to engage further with Wiesel's ideas. "Listening to a witness makes you a witness," said Wiesel. Ariel Burger's book is an invitation to every reader to become Wiesel's student and witness. *Witness: Lessons from Elie Wiesel's Classroom* may be checked out from the Alfred Ratner Library.

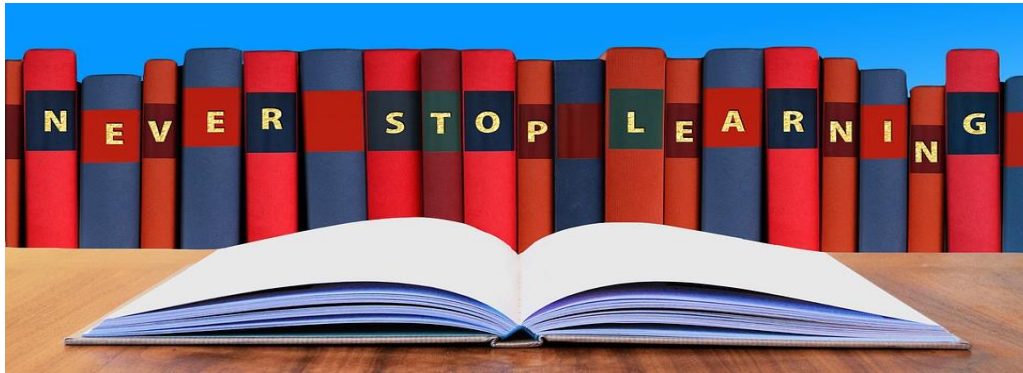

CEI BOARD MEETING MINUTES, Wednesday, September 11, 2019

ATTENDING: Virginia Lieberman, Julie Goldstein, Mary Ellen Kane, Bruce Kaufer, Terri Katzman, Irene Rothschild, Rabbi Lenny Sarko. **GUESTS:** Joel Last and Richard Virshup

WELCOME REMARKS: Irene welcomed Rabbi Lenny to the first of many CEI Board meetings.

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING: The minutes of the August meeting were approved as published in the September Bulletin.

D'VAR TORAH: Rabbi Lenny offered a prayer to honor his first participation in CEI Board meetings.

RABBI REPORT: Rabbi Lenny remarked that he has had an interesting couple of weeks. He believes people are enjoying the services. He has been meeting and talking to lots of people. Everything seems to be moving along. He is preparing for the High Holidays. He thanks all for welcoming him and his wife, Karen, to the community. They are mostly unpacked. He has visited with several people who are unable to come to services and had several conversations with others. Rabbi Lenny has an open door policy so Congregants do not have to make an appointment to see him. Several people have stopped in or emailed him. CEI Congregants can also call him directly. He has a local number that can be used besides the office number. On the second day of Rosh Hashanah, Rabbi is willing to visit and do something with those who are unable to attend services at CEI. A short discussion ensued about the parameters of conversion that will need to be discussed in more depth and a policy developed.

TREASURER REPORT: Memorial Book donations are up. Electric bills are up. Julie will check on why they have increased and possibly change suppliers. She needed to take a tranche from Restricted Funds.

PRESIDENT REPORT: Irene sent Zach Virshup a letter thanking him for doing such a great job on updating the current CEI website after he got the codes that he needed from Jon Reiter. Rabbi Lenny is working on a totally new site that he is developing through the free service of URJ. He will be asking for some people to help with this. Julie will help to update. Irene asked Gary to have the Men's Club pack up all of the old prayer books, etc. for burial. Rabbi Lenny has given us boxes for that purpose. They will probably be buried in the spring. Irene asked for volunteers to bring out the High Holiday prayer books from the storage room and replace the Mishkan T'filah on Sunday, September 29. Bruce and Joel will do that. She passed a list of Shabbat services and asked for volunteers to read the announcements. Irene thinks that it would be appropriate if CEI held a commemoration for the victims of the Tree of Life shootings on Sunday, October 27. After discussion, it was decided that Rabbi Lenny will contact Seton Hill to see what is being planned for there. It may be an option to do something at the Shabbat service on October 25.

ADMINISTRATION: Bea will be on vacation from September 26 through October 4. Irene is working on getting coverage for the days that the office will be open. The office will be closed September 30 and October 1.

SISTERHOOD: Sisterhood had a wonderful tour of the biblical gardens at Rodef Shalom in August. Eight members attended the tour. Lunch followed at the Mediterranean Grill. Opening Brunch will be at the Lamplighter on September 22 at 11:00 AM. Sisterhood is sponsoring the Break-the-Fast. Reservations are being taken by Terri Katzman. A sign-up sheet is on the desk in the office. On October 23, Sisterhood will host a Chocolate party at McFeely's Gourmet Chocolate on Pennsylvania Avenue in Greensburg. 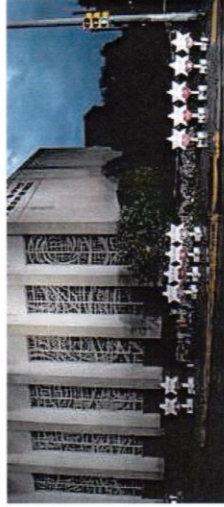

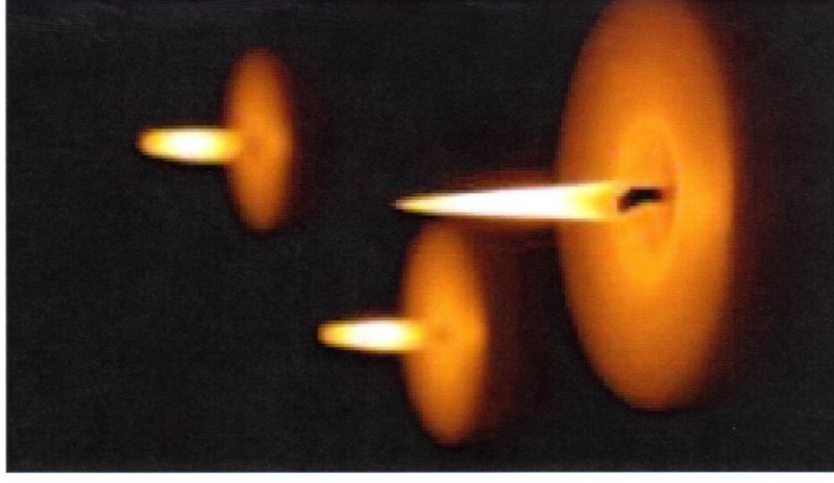
